Institute for Women's Policy Research (IWPR)
Scholars' Papers on Paid Leave and Occupational Segregation

To commemorate the 50th Anniversary of 1963's *American Women: Report of the President's Commission on the Status of Women*, the U.S. Department of Labor Women's Bureau sponsored a series of Scholars' Papers. As part of this effort, IWPR prepared two reports. [Paid Parental Leave in the United States](#) reviews research on the benefits of paid parental leave from the perspective of individuals, families, employers, and the economy overall. [Occupational Segregation and the Gender Wage Gap: A Job Half Done](#) evaluates trends in occupational segregation over the last several decades—particularly the wage penalty for work in female dominated occupations—and ends with policy recommendations.

First White House Working Dads Event

New York Mets third baseman [Daniel Murphy](#) caused quite a stir earlier this year when he missed opening day to be with his newborn son. Murphy has since become a focal point of the conversation about the changing roles of fathers, including an appearance at a [White House convening on working dads](#). The meeting focused on the changing demographics of families and the need to reimagine workplace policies so they allow men to be good workers, while also being good parents. Data

compiled by the [Council of Economic Advisors](#) shows that, more than ever before, fathers are involved in child care and housework responsibilities. As their roles at home change, dads are experiencing work/family conflict at increasingly high rates.
