VERMONT COMMISSION ON WOMEN GROUP AGREEMENTS

Adopted September 9, 2022

Re-affirmed October 20, 2023

In meetings of the Vermont Commission on Women, we agree that we will:

- ❖ Treat all who are in the meeting with respect and dignity
- ❖ Listen openly to each other with curiosity and interest
- ❖ Take space, make space, hold space – this means:
 - Share as much of our authentic selves as we are comfortable with
 - Step back to allow others to speak, so that no one is dominating the conversation
 - Create opportunities for the voices that have minority opinions
- ❖ When we disagree, we do so with respect for each other's perspectives
- ❖ Be aware of our own body language and use it to communicate respect
- ❖ Acknowledge and take into consideration those perspectives that are not represented by people in the room
- ❖ Take responsibility for the impact of our words and actions on each other
- ❖ Bring self-awareness of our own state of mind, emotions, and influences
- ❖ Remember that we come to the space with differing understandings of how we communicate
- ❖ Understand we all make mistakes
- ❖ Be patient with ourselves and others
- ❖ Share the job of holding each other accountable to these agreements
